



STORAGE OF EQUIPMENT AT CLUB HOUSE

- **Any equipment stored at the clubhouse is at the owner's risk. RCC is not held responsible for theft or damage.**
- **All equipment should be clearly labeled with owner's name or it will be considered to be club equipment and used as such.**
- **It is recommended that kayaks that are not to be used for club events are secured with a "CLUB LOCK" style steering wheel lock over the cock pit. It is preferable that kayaks are not chained to the timber racks as this prevents movement of kayaks and limits access in some situations.**
- **Any clothing or small items should be secured in one of the lockers. We do not encourage leaving small items and paddle clothing at the clubhouse.**
- **Kayaks are to be stored on the racks in a neat and tidy way. If kayaks or equipment is left on the floor or in the way you will run the risk of your storage privileges being removed.**
- **\$100 per boat per 12 month period**
- **Each committee member holds a clubhouse key.**
- **Club members can apply in writing after a minimum 1 year as a member or at the discretion of the committee to hold a clubhouse key. Members will need to demonstrate to a Club qualified Instructor, their basic skills in paddling and their understanding of the hazards of kayaking in the Cooks River. It is highly recommended to never paddle alone.**
A \$50 key deposit is required and to be paid directly to the Treasurer, who will notify the Secretary to arrange the key.
- **You will be responsible for the security of the clubhouse when accessing a boat. Always reset the alarm and turn off the power (red switch at stair)**
- **Committee members, as a privilege, can store 1 kayak at the clubhouse without cost.**
